Funding

Blue Sky Training, Wellington

Blue Sky Training will expand access to HVAC and electrification education by developing a mobile heat pump training lab for rural communities in Southern Colorado and the Western Slope; offering NATE-qualified heat pump coursework; and providing a responsible decarbonization course for HVAC and insulation contractors.

Collaborative Healing Initiatives Within Communities (CHIC), Denver

CHIC offers social, emotional, cultural and career enrichment for women facing barriers to economic mobility. The organization will support participants in its pre-apprenticeship program by covering essential needs and basic expenses as they work toward completing training and securing employment.

Colorado Mountain College (CMC), Glenwood Springs

In partnership with R&H Mechanical, CMC will expand its HVAC career pathway and reach more students by developing mobile instructional equipment and supplies for multiple sites across the Roaring Fork and Colorado River Valley region. CMC will also enhance support for multilingual learners pursuing HVAC courses.

ZoZo Group, Denver

ZoZo Group will launch an awareness campaign to promote the three occupations of the Clean Energy Careers program with a specific goal of increasing diversity in the workforce that serves Xcel Energy's service territories in Colorado.
