- City has been working on energy initiatives for years, need more help










What is Partners in Energy?





Guided by a clear vision

Golden Valley will be a more sustainable and resilient community, where the benefits of using and sourcing energy wisely accrue equitably to every resident, business, and visitor.

We'll focus in 3 areas

- Reducing high energy cost burden
- Improving energy efficiency
- Supporting clean energy





Our Goals 2021 - 2031



Eliminate 65,000 tons of greenhouse gas

emissions through electricity and natural gas savings in Golden Valley in the next 10 years — exclusive of Xcel Energy's grid decarbonization efforts. A reduction of approximately 30% vs. baseline.



Add an estimated \$8.8 million in first year energy savings to Golden Valley's economy

in 10 years with savings that residents and businesses will see from more efficient use of energy.



Help Golden Valley households most severely impacted by the costs of energy.

We will both make certain that these households are aware that help is available and help them to navigate the steps necessary to get the help they need.




